
As editor of THISTLEDOWN, I hope to become better acquainted will all you fine poets. I look forward to serving you and count on your help, support and understanding.





February Assignment

This month's assignment is a poem written in blank verse.

An unrhymed form, blank verse is usually written in iambic pentameter, referred to as heroic blank verse. Most meditative poetry and nearly all peotic drama have been composed in this medium. Untermeyer observes that because the rhythm of iambic pentameter is so close to speech, it is therefore so flexible, scholars consider it to be the most important meter in the literature of the western world. Blank verse is not confined to stanzas of uniform length. The breaks come at the conclusion of thoughts, as paragraphs in prose. The freedom of expression in blank verse lends itself to the use of run-on lines, which to

complete their meaning, run over to the next line without a pause. --Viola Jacobson Berg from PATHWAYS for the POET
