However, many of our members have expressed a desire to have a meeting at another, later date, and <u>the date chosen is October 21<sup>st</sup></u>. Since this creates an overlap with other scheduled activities at Barnes & Noble <u>the meeting will be at the new City Library of North Mankato</u>, between 1:00 and 3:30 p.m. <u>The library is located next to the North Mankato City Hall on Belgrade Avenue</u>.

As we hope to hold a small critiquing workshop you are advised to bring a pad or some other item to support your writing. While there is plenty of seating space, there is not a huge amount of desk space. It would be nice if you were to bring not only poems to share but also a 'special' poem, one you like but are not quite satisfied with. It should be either typed or written in neat handwriting. Short poems not taking more than one page are preferred.

We will also try to hold a group 'meditation' to begin what should become an ongoing effort to elicit the particular aspects of poetry writing of concern to individual members and as a reference for future program planning.
