e informed about the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment:

On Nov. 4th, Minnesotans will be asked to vote on the Amendment for Clean Water, Wildlife, Cultural Heritage, and Natural Areas. This amendment would dedicate state funding to the support of Minnesota's natural resources and arts and culture. The funds will be raised via a sales tax of 3/8ths of one percent. This amendment could, among other things, triple the funding for the Minnesota State Arts Board and the regional arts councils, leading to more arts programming and more support for individual artists.

reach out to their audiences.



Come to our October meeting for an introduction to poetry as performance. We'll watch & listen to recordings of master performers. We'll talk about what it means to "perform" poetry.

And bring one of your own poems -- one that lends itself to a bit of extra drama or flair. Don't worry -- you won't have to perform it. (But you might get to perform someone else's poem!)
