

Many of you have already heard the sad news that Minnesota poet and essayist Bill Holm passed away on February 25, 2009 at the age of 65. Holm was an award-winning author and a beloved figure on the Minnesota literary scene,



remembered not only for his intimate literary observations of life in Minnesota, Iceland, and elsewhere, but also for his larger-than-life presence on the stage and in the classroom.

We send our sympathies to SMPS member John Rezmerski, who was a close friend of Holm's.

Garrison Keillor called Holm, who appeared often on A Prairie Home Companion, "the sage of Minnesota." John Rezmerski called him "a missionary for the life of the mind." Minnesota will miss him.

✓ WordWalk: A Poetry Competition (up to 8 winners will receive a city-wide honor!)

Twin Rivers Center for the Arts, the City Center Business Association, the Southern Minnesota Poets Society, and the City of Mankato invite the public to enter a sidewalk poetry contest. This new project will permanently install poems to enhance our city sidewalks, starting in Mankato's City Center. We are looking for short poems that provide a delightful moment of outdoor reading. Poems may be inspiring, funny, meaningful, cynical, mundane ... anything appropriate for the general public. - Open to all area writers of any age, published or not. Each contestant may submit up to three poems.
- Poems should be short and create an easy-to-read sidewalk experience, **200 characters max including spaces (not words)**. Each line of the poem can be no longer than **30** characters total. Poems must be text only (no images) and be in English. Entries must be original work by the entrant, previously published or unpublished. Poems may be about any subject. No vulgar, abusive or sexually explicit language will be accepted.
- Up to **8 poems** will be selected. Each winning poet will receive publication in a printed book, on a project website, and on city sidewalks. Honorable mentions will also be published. Entries will be blind-judged anonymously by a past president of the National Federation of State Poetry Societies.
- Selected poems will be permanently installed in many sites throughout the City of Mankato over the course of several years, beginning with the City Center in Summer 2009. Attribution of authorship will be provided in the printed book and on the project website but not in the sidewalk.
- Each entry may contain up to three poems, typed, one poem per page with no identifying marks. Please include two copies of
 each poem. Each entry must also include a \$5 entry fee (payable to Twin Rivers Center for the Arts) and the following information on a separate sheet of paper: Writer's name, address, telephone number, e-mail address, and title and first line of each
 poem. One entry per contestant. Non-winning entries will not be returned. Please enclose a stamped, self-addresses envelope
 for results if desired.
- Postmark deadline for submissions is **March 16, 2009**. Winners will be announced on the Twin Rivers Center for the Arts website (www.twinriversarts.org) on April 20, 2009
